ITEM 13. DISCUSSION REGARDING 4.1 / OUTFALLS.

Mayor Sheldon opened Item 13 up for public comment. Hearing and seeing none, Mayor Sheldon closed the public comment. Mayor Sheldon invited Director Jenkins to the podium. Director Jenkins updated Council on offshore outfall opportunities. Director Jenkins recommended getting one of the outfalls installed during Segment 4.1 improvement project. Director Jenkins discussed the project limits and North Myrtle Beach's outfall project. Director Jenkins discussed budgeting and Restore Act funds. Mayor Sheldon noted this item was available for discussion. Hearing and seeing none. Mayor Sheldon reported on his conversations with the Mayor of Myrtle Beach. Discussions regarding the purpose of an outfall took place. Councilman Jarman discussed looking for grants to help fund the project. Councilman Casto reported this is one of his number one projects. Councilman Casto discussed flooding a Lakeview. Discussion regarding Myrtle Beach and North Myrtle Beach's outfalls took place. Vice Mayor McConnell noted he was pleased that the Administration was pulling for the current budget. Vice Mayor McConnell asked that the funding, including the Restore Act contribution, be more fully defined coming back to Council. All council members noted their support.

CITY MANAGER REPORT

Mr. O'Rourke reported Staff was closely monitoring Hurricane Delta. Mr. O'Rourke reported the City as complying with the FBI subpoena records request. Mr. O'Rourke explained the difference between an FBI request and a standard records request. Mr. O'Rourke added that several parties had requested copies of the records from the subpoena. Mr. O'Rourke recommended, after the review and redaction, the parties interested in the records jointly share in the cost the

produce those records. Mr. O'Rourke reported, at this point, 27% of residents had returned the citizen survey. Mr. O'Rourke reported pickleball lighting at Lyndell Center was just around the corner. Mr. O'Rourke added that Director Ponek was working on it and it should take about 6 weeks. Mr. O'Rourke provided early warning that a portion of Gayle's Trails would be closed for about 60 days because of the Bay Parkway improvements. Mr. O'Rourke reported that the new city website should be up and running mid-December. Mr. O'Rourke added that he would bring to the Council on October 22nd a comprehensive job classification study for view.

CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

Mrs. Myers reported there were three regular meetings left in the 2020 calendar year.

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilman Jarman reported he was pleased with the direction the City was moving.

Vice Mayor McConnell reported, unfortunately, Bay County and PCB were leading the in the State of Florida, per capita, in pedestrian and bicycle deaths. Vice Mayor McConnell recommended Council spend some money on signs for Front Beach Road stating that it is state law to stop for pedestrians. Vice Mayor McConnell recommended PCB Police have a high area of focus/enforcement in that area and the CRA do a deep dive regarding crosswalks. Vice Mayor McConnell called for a PSA and a push from the City's PIO on pedestrian and bike safety. Council members concurred and discussed a holistic approach on pedestrian and bike safety.

Mayor Sheldon asked if Council could get an update on Bay Parkway, phase 2. City Manager O'Rourke reported that it was on schedule despite the rains and should open early spring. Mayor Sheldon reported on a paint striping system that Bay County uses on ballfields. Mayor Sheldon reported that the costs would be offset by not hiring. Director Ponek concurred. Manager O'Rourke noted they would bring back a report. Mayor Sheldon wished Jason Pickle a happy birthday!

With nothing further, the meeting was adjourned at 7:15 PM
