ITEM 1. ORDINANCE NO. 1633, ADDING A NEW CHAPTER 30 "PENSIONS" FOR PANAMA CITY BEACH POLICE OFFICERS' PENSION PLAN, SECOND READING / PUBLIC HEARING.

Vice Mayor Casto introduced City Attorney Cole Davis. Mr. Davis read Ordinance 1633 by title only. Vice Mayor Casto opened the public hearing. Hearing and seeing no comments, Vice Mayor Casto closed the public hearing.

Vice Mayor Casto invited comments from Assistant City Manager Holly White. Ms. White explained the main purpose of this Ordinance, and the next two, was to codify the Pension Plans into the City's Code of Ordinances in a new Chapter and Article, 30. Ms. White further explained codification of the Ordinances

would make it easier and more efficient to research pension questions and issues. Ms. White added in addition to the codification, the Ordinances incorporated two minor changes that had not previously been considered by the Council: (1) the mortality table utilized to calculate the actuarial equivalent, was updated from the 1983 Group Annuity Mortality Table for Males to the RP 2000 Generational Mortality Table; and (2) a change to Section 30-77(b)(2) to change the effective date of an election to participate in the DROP to the first day of the first calendar month subsequent to the election date. Ms. White explained further that previous language indicated an effective date on the first day of the first calendar month at least fifteen (15) business days after an election was received from a Member. Ms. White reported that the City's Actuary found no actuarial impact to each Plan.

Vice Mayor Casto noted this item was available to Council. Councilman Chester moved to approve Ordinance 1633. Councilmember Coburn seconded the motion. Vice Mayor Casto called for further discussion. Hearing and seeing none, Ordinance 1633 was unanimously adopted by a (4-0) roll call vote.

ITEM 4. ORDINANCE NO. 1636, RESTRICTIONS ON EVENTS AT AARON BESSANT PARK, SECOND READING / PUBLIC HEARING.

Vice Mayor Casto introduced City Attorney Cole Davis. Mr. Davis read Ordinance 1636 by title only. Vice Mayor Casto opened the public hearing.

1. Molly Allen, Lullwater Lake Resident – Ms. Allen commented that there appeared to be no ending time on special events. Ms. Allen asked Council to add language to the ordinance to end special events, especially in the summer, at a reasonable time, especially on Sundays. Ms. Allen asked if this ordinance would be codified as well.

Vice Mayor Casto called for additional public comments. Hearing and seeing none, Vice Mayor Casto closed the public hearing.

City Manager Whitman reviewed ending times of special events at Aaron Bessant Park, including a Sunday event ending at 10 pm. Manager Whitman explained that he could not single out/limit the ordinance to one group. Manager Whitman explained that every ordinance was codified.

Vice Mayor Casto noted this item was available to Council. Vice Mayor Casto clarified that currently ending times were 10 pm, unless it was July 4th. Manager Whitman concurred.

Councilmember Coburn recommended Council adjust the ending time in this ordinance to 8 pm on Sunday. A brief discussion regarding reducing congestion and the 8 pm ending time not affecting the Summer Concert series took place.

Councilmember Coburn moved to amend Ordinance 1636 to change the ending time of a special event at Aaron Bessant Park to 8:00 p.m. on Sunday.

Sec. 4-25. - Limitation of Special Events.

(2) No Special Event shall be permitted to take place, in whole or in part, at Aaron Bessant Park on any Friday, Saturday, or before 12:00 p.m. and after 8:00 p.m. on Sunday between the last Monday in May ("Memorial Day") and the first Monday in September ("Labor Day") in any given year.

Councilman Chester seconded the motion. Vice Mayor Casto called for further discussion. Hearing and seeing none, Vice Mayor Casto asked the Clerk to call the roll on the motion to amend the ordinance. Ordinance 1636 was adopted, as amended, by a (3-1) roll call vote.
